"We are offering an EQ-HR workshop (Emotional Intelligence and Human Relations Skills) at the Duncan Center, Delray Beach, Florida, April 14-17, 2015. This is training in "people" skills that are so vital for effective ministry in the 21st century.

This training will raise the inter-personal, intra-group skills of your church professionals. Clergy who are unable to make meaningful connections with their congregation will normally find themselves in conflict much of the time. Research by Speed Leas, when he was with Alban Institute and conducted

research on the Involuntary Termination of Clergy, discovered that when sexual malfeasance was taken out of the picture, the number one reason these clergy got fired was their lack of inter-personal skills.

Skills in developing meaningful relations with congregants, community develop, or resolving inter-personal differences are not taught in seminaries. Yet, training in emotional intelligence is now considered the most valuable skill development process for potential leaders in the corporate world. Our mission is to bring this training into the world of congregations within all mainline denominations.”
